



WHEN KIDS ASK...



“What is Heaven like?”

Why kids might ask:

Children often think in pictures, but imagining what happens after death can be hard. Instead of thinking about burial or cremation, many kids prefer to picture a “better place” for those who have died. Some have heard that heaven is where people go after death, and imagining such a place can be both inspiring and confusing. Kids might struggle with believing in something they can’t see. If they’ve heard that God is in heaven, they may find comfort thinking of the dead living with God in another realm. Kids may also wonder about their own deaths or those of others, seeking reassurance that they won’t go to a terrible place after they die. Additionally, some may be skeptical of the idea of an invisible place after death.



...➤ What the Bible says:



The word “heaven” literally means “sky.” The Bible starts by saying that God created the heavens and the earth. The Bible often refers to “heavens” (plural), indicating that there is more than one. We can see this, too, since the skies (heavens) can be sunny, cloudy, dark with stars, or colorful with sunrises and sunsets. The heavens can also appear close or far, filled with moons, planets, and stars or the sun and clouds. The Bible says that all of creation in the heavens praises God and does exactly what God wants.

God is present in the heavens, and the Bible says that God’s throne is there. But God is also present on earth and everywhere else, including with the dead. There is no place outside of God’s presence; so we don’t need to go to heaven to be with God. The Bible doesn’t say the dead go to heaven; it uses the idea of “sleep” to describe death. The Bible shows that God can reach those who have died, as God’s voice has spoken from the heavens to both the living and the dead.

While many stories in the Bible describe people who died and were brought back to life, only one person—Jesus—was resurrected, meaning He will never die again. Jesus’ resurrection gives us insight into what happens after death. He ascended to heaven to rule from God’s throne, and there are glimpses in the Bible of humans, both living and dead, being invited into God’s heavenly presence. The Bible promises a future resurrection, where the dead will rise, and God will live with them in a new heaven and a new earth. God’s throne will come down from heaven to the new earth, and humans will live with God forever. This new life with God will be beautiful and is described in Revelation 21-22.

...➤ What you could discuss:

With preschool ages: “The Bible tells us that God cares for people who are alive or dead.

God has made beautiful places for all who have died. They can’t come back to visit, and we can’t go and see them. But God takes care of everyone. God can be everywhere at one time, including with someone who has died, even though people can’t do that.”

With school ages: “The Bible tells us that God created the heavens and the earth, and that God can be everywhere at once. When people die, they aren’t able to do things with us on earth anymore, and we can’t see them or talk to them. Still God takes care of people after they die and is with them at the same time as God is with us while we are still alive. The Bible tells us that God can give people who die new resurrected bodies, which means that their bodies can’t die anymore. Also God is preparing a new heaven and new earth for those who have died and those who are still alive.”

...➤ What you could do:

Enjoy the Heavens: The Bible speaks of the glory of God filling the heavens. Explore the wonders of the sky—use a telescope or a phone app to find constellations, planets, or galaxies. Enjoy watching clouds, sunrises, or sunsets. Talk about your favorite heaven or imagine those who have passed away enjoying that heaven with you.

Imagine God’s Throne: Picture you and loved ones who have passed—being invited into God’s throne room. What would you see, hear, smell, taste, or touch there? What would you say to the heavenly council or those who have died? Create art or poetry together to depict these scenes.

Look to Resurrection: Imagine resurrection day. Think about where you and those who have died will be when it happens. What will you do or say to those who have passed? Create a picture of your ideal home in the new earth and what the new heaven will look like.
